Two-day Portraiture Workshop with Esterita Austin Saturday and Sunday, May 14 and 15, from 10 am to 4 pm




Cost to non-members - \$140.

For Sale: Handi Quilter Sweet Sixteen Sit-Down Longarm with Trustitch



This HQ Sweet Sixteen sit-down machine was purchased new in June 2012. It's a great little machine, in "like-new" condition, and has been used to quilt approximately a dozen small quilts. The machine is located in Long Valley, NJ, and the buyer must be able to pick it up from there.

This HandiQuilter Sweet 16 includes the following standard features:

- 36" x 30" height adjustable table
- Color touch screen with up & down needle stop position control
- Closed and open toe hopping feet
- Five M-class bobbins and HQ bobbin winder
- User manuals and "getting started" DVD
- Remaining 6 years of HQ casting/machining warranty can be transferred to buyer



This machine includes the Trustitch stitch regulation system that helps you achieve consistently even stitch lengths regardless of stitching speed Additional accessories include:

- Table overlap (\$90 value)
- 3 Quilter's Academy Sit-Down Longarm Quilting videos (\$75 value)
- "Grip & Stitch" quilting disks for free motion quilting (\$30 value)

The Market Place had a fabulous opening at the December meeting! It will return in June!!


